



**COMMUNIQUE OF THE ACADEMIC SENATE**

On this Thursday February 21<sup>st</sup> 2019, an ordinary Senate meeting chaired by Father Dr. Fabien HAGENIMANA, the Vice Chancellor of INES Ruhengeri and Chairperson of the Academic Senate, was convened in Christus Vincit Room and made the following resolutions and recommendations:

1. The Senate resolved that an official letter be written to Muvunyi Mohamed (Reg. No: 12/5872), a graduate in the Department of Law, requesting him to bring back to INES Ruhengeri the Degree that was conferred to him with a wrong classification by February 22<sup>nd</sup> 2019 and the Dean of the Faculty of Law has to ensure the implementation of this resolution.
2. The Senate resolved that the penalty inflicted to Niyomubyeyi Jean Pierre (Reg. No. 17/11823) and Muhimpundu Audrey Sandrine (Reg. No: 17/11714) for attempt to cheat be revisited and these be given zero in the module where they attempted to cheat (Transportation Engineering II) and retake the module in the academic year 2018-2019.
3. The Senate resolved that from now on the Career Day will be exclusively held in English and the best presenters will be identified and rewarded.
4. The Senate approved 718 candidates for the 10<sup>th</sup> graduation of 15<sup>th</sup> March 2019 and resolved to request them to complete their files not later than February 21, 2019 and those who do not, are to be removed from the graduation list.
5. The Senate resolved that the activities of dissertations' discussion shall resume after graduation.
6. The Senate approved the number of graduands to be ready by Friday February 22, 2019.
7. The Senate resolved that Igiraneza Marthe Aline (Reg. No. 14/7690) from BLS Level IV be given a penalty of one-year temporary exclusion because of cheating and her results of the respective Level should be nullified in accordance with the article 81 of the General Academic Regulations of INES Ruhengeri.

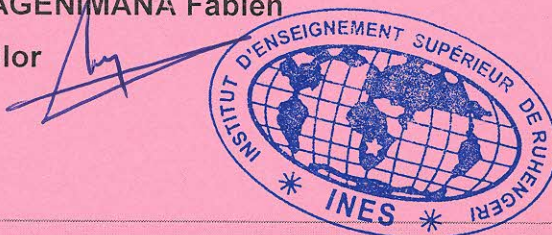




8. The Senate resolved that Hagenimana Nelly Téléspore re-sits for the exams of Economic Business and Finance for Civil Engineering, Ground Improvement Techniques, Transportation Engineering I and Irrigation and Drainage Engineering.
9. The Senate resolved that the administration of special exams should follow the procedures of normal exam administration to ensure proper moderation, marking, recording of attendance and filing.
10. The Senate approved new programmes and short courses initiatives and recommended that any Department that wants to introduce new programmes and/or revise the programme should ensure there is an advisory role from external experts. The Departments have to make sure the programmes are polished within one month and the related activities have to be minimized.
11. The Senate established a committee made of the Director of Quality Assurance and Academic Registrar, the HoD of Applied Economics, the HoD of Computer Science and the Director of ICT which is to ensure a quickened development of INES Smart Campus.
12. The Senate approved the Internal Exam moderation form.
13. The Senate resolved that a Sub-Senate meeting will be held to deliberate the classes of Applied Economics (Rural Development Economy Level III & IV Weekend Programme) and Civil Engineering (Level I March Intake Day Programme and Level III & IV Weekend Programme).
14. The Senate recommended that the Vice Chancellor writes an official letter to Ndekezi Frank (Reg. No. 17/11030) from Civil Engineering Level II C requesting him to provide explanations about his insults against his Lecturer Eng. Simon Niyitegeka.
